PURPOSE

The Sharron Cooke Annual Legacy Award was created to memorialize the vision and collaborative spirit of the late Sharron Cooke, former OARC President, and was conceptualized (with Sharron's help!) as a way to honour the people who live and work in Ontario long-term care (LTC) homes. The award recognizes teams who have demonstrated a commitment to authentic communication, relationship-building, establishing trust, and inspiring a sense of hope. This award is based on these principles and supported by the influence of Residents' Councils in every LTC home.

The purpose of the Award is to encourage and celebrate long-term care homes that promote a culture of open, authentic communication and collaboration between residents and team members. Sharron envisioned a time when all homes would embrace the principles of 'culture change', a process described by the United-Statesbased Pioneer Network, as "...the transformation of older adult services, based on person-directed values and practices where the voices of elders and those working most closely with them are solicited, respected and honored. Core person-directed

values are relationship, choice, dignity, respect, self-determination and purposeful living."

As a relational and strengths-based leader, Sharron believed in the importance of relationship-building and partnerships between residents and Residents' Councils and their team members and home leadership. Relationships in the long-term care home transform it into a HOME, shaped BY and WITH residents. This award celebrates homes that have been on their own 'culture change' journey.



AWARD

The winning LTC home team will be consulted to select a prize item (valued up to \$500) that helps to bring people together to build community in their home. We recognize that prizes are not 'one size fits all' and the intention of this Award is to afford flexibility to select a prize that best suits your home's current needs and resident preferences.

Below is a sample list of prizes, but your innovative ideas are most welcome:

- Outdoor enhancements: Flagpole, Raised Garden Planters, Patio Umbrella, BBQ, garden centre gift card etc.
- Residents' Council Meeting Materials Talking Sticks, Projector,
 Microphone, portable speaker, branded merchandise etc.
- Gift certificate for a custom Residents' Council Board or other Information Board of your choosing
- Utility/Activity cart (to create a mobile Residents' Council cart, for example)
- Gift card towards something else for Residents' Council... and more!

ELIGIBILITY

In conjunction with the purpose of the Award, applicants must also meet the following eligibility:

- Applications must include a Team Member(s) and Resident(s)
- The applicants must work/reside in a long-term care home in Ontario
- Applications should be no more than 1100 words
- Recipients of the Sharron Cooke Legacy Award may apply for the award again 2 years after receiving the Sharron Cooke Legacy Award

CRITERIA

Application packages must include the following:

- Application form jointly completed by a Team Member(s) and Resident(s)
- 2. Description of how the initiative has positively influenced your home in <u>at</u> <u>least one</u> of the following areas:
 - Building trust and inspiring hope
 - Enhancing communication
 - Building compassion and empathy
 - Facilitating resident to resident peer support and friendships
- Include direct feedback/quotes from residents, team members, home leadership, and other members of your community to illustrate the impact of your project
- Include pictures to support your application email to <u>ilangston@ontarc.com</u> in a .jpeg format

SELECTION

Using the criterion outlined above, a Working Group comprised of OARC Resident Leaders will review the applications and select a winner. The LTC home's Residents' Council, Council Assistant and the home's Administrator will be notified in the first week of September. All applicants will be notified, via email, to learn if they are successful. Prizes will be coordinated in September, but delivery times might vary depending on the chosen item.

Sharron Cooke was a beacon of hope and a source of inspiration for residents, team members and long-term care sector partners across the province. As former Director and Chair of the OARC Board of Directors, Sharron led with compassion and focus for over a decade. She gave selflessly to others and was guided by a fierce sense of determination and a commitment to enhancing quality of life for all residents living in long-term care.

Sharron spoke with conviction and was not afraid to challenge the status quo. Her advocacy work included participation on countless government committees and stakeholder groups,

she offered insightful contributions to research and resource development, she infused resident voice into presentations and course curricula, and she was a devoted mentor, teacher and friend to team members, students and fellow Resident Leaders.

Before her passing in August 2022, Sharron helped to articulate her hopes for an annual recognition award, for a long-term care home that embodied the culture change principles she so admired and strived to promote. Her final wish for her peers was to live in a long-term care home with a culture that welcomes open communication, builds trust, hope and friendships.
