On October 22nd, REAL member Steven Wenzowski was a guest speaker for Advantage Ontario's Administrator Leadership Program. With support from OARC team member Stephanie, Steven delivered a presentation on the resident experience in long-term care where he highlighted the unique role Administrators play in setting a positive tone in the home and in modeling a person-centered, resident-directed attitude for their

team. Drawing from his famous book of poignant "one-liners," Steven challenged the group of future Administrators to "be the thermostat in the home, not a thermometer" – in other words, great Administrators set the direction or tone in the home rather than simply responding to what is happening. OARC is thankful for the opportunity to participate in the Administrator Leadership Program year after year, and for the enthusiastic, engaged groups of students we have connected with.

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There was no shortage of excitement at peopleCare Tavistock earlier this week. On October 28th, OARC's Dee Tripp had the special opportunity to be part of the move-in day activities at the new home, which included the warm reception of 82 residents as they arrived in their new residence.

Dee described the experience as being heart-warming, resident-centred, seamlessly organized, and joyful... ending with a celebratory champagne toast! On a tour alongside the the mayor, Dee observed many design features and details throughout the home to promote connection and honour residents' individuality. Personalized 'word clouds' were thoughtfully placed outside every residents' room, showcasing their unique identities and preferences. Dee noted the absence of traditional nursing stations, replaced by spacious lounges where team members can sit beside residents to socialize and complete their daily documentation. Dedicated storage spaces help to keep equipment such as lifts out of sight in the hallways, and safely stowed away.

Dee also learned the unique history of peopleCare Tavistock, with the original building being a repurposed school house, with cinderblock walls and smaller rooms.

The true highlight of the day were the smiling faces of the residents, including introductions to members of the Residents' Council Leadership team. Interactions with friends Joyce and Cheryl (photographed below with Dee) exemplified the warm, community feel that residents and team members already have coming into their new space. The group eagerly awaits the arrival of many new residents in the days to come.
